

In This Issue: Spotlight on Pesticide Resistance

Pesticide resistance is one of the biggest challenges facing arable farming today. Whether dealing with **pests, weeds or diseases**, heavy reliance on chemicals increases the pressure on these organisms to adapt and thrive despite pesticide applications. That's why **IPM** and **resistance management** go hand in hand. When IPM is used well, it helps reduce the need for chemicals and lowers the chances of resistance developing. But once resistance sets in, non-chemical IPM tools may be the only options left.

In this issue, we're shining a spotlight on resistance—rounding up key messages from the **AHDB Resistance Roadshow** and pointing you towards **Resistance Resources** to help tackle the problem.



The AHDB Resistance Roadshow: A Summary

Over the winter, the **AHDB Resistance Roadshow** has been travelling around the UK, bringing together farmers, advisers and resistance specialists to share the latest insights. At the **Morpeth Resistance Roadshow on 10th February**, **Lynn Tatnell** (ADAS), **Sacha White** (AHDB) and **Fiona Burnett** (VI) shared updates on the current status of herbicide, insecticide and fungicide resistance.



The AHDB Resistance Roadshow: Key Messages

Fungicides

- ❖ **Reduce the dose:** lower doses and fewer applications prolong fungicide efficacy
- ❖ **Mix and alternate:** mixing and alternating MoA used offers the best protection
- ❖ **Curative vs protectant use:** timing and strategy matters, but protectant applications may reduce the need for future applications



Insecticides

- ❖ **Follow label rates:** unlike fungicides, insecticides must only be used at their full rate to minimise resistance risk.
- ❖ **Present danger:** at least 10 species have developed resistance to pyrethroids
- ❖ **Importance of maintaining pyrethroid efficacy:** in many cases, limited alternatives are available

Herbicides

- ❖ **Follow label rates:** use the right herbicide, follow label rates and application timings
- ❖ **Mix it up:** use a wide range of MoA groups, avoid repeat use of the same MoA in one season
- ❖ **Avoid high-risk MoA groups:** e.g. ALS (sulphonylurea) and ACCase (fops, dims and dens)
- ❖ **Monitoring and testing:** know your weed populations and test for resistance every 2-3 years




